Each Annual Meeting, I've been reporting on developments and County projects in our vicinity. Some County projects have been delayed or canceled. One has prevailed and is nearing reality.

- Gude Landfill Remediation History since 2009
- When we bought our home in 1985, one of the advertised benefits was a future recreation area nearby
 - We didn't realize it was planned on top of a landfill closed in 1982, just 3 years earlier
 - That didn't actually influence our purchase decision because we were more interested in the location and home plans for the development
- Now, 36 years later, the outlook is bright for completion of a park in the next five years.
- There was a public community meeting on April 8, 2021 sponsored by the County DEP
 - Held virtually using the Microsoft Teams application
 - Emails were sent to all our residents on my distribution, but not many of our homeowners attended.
